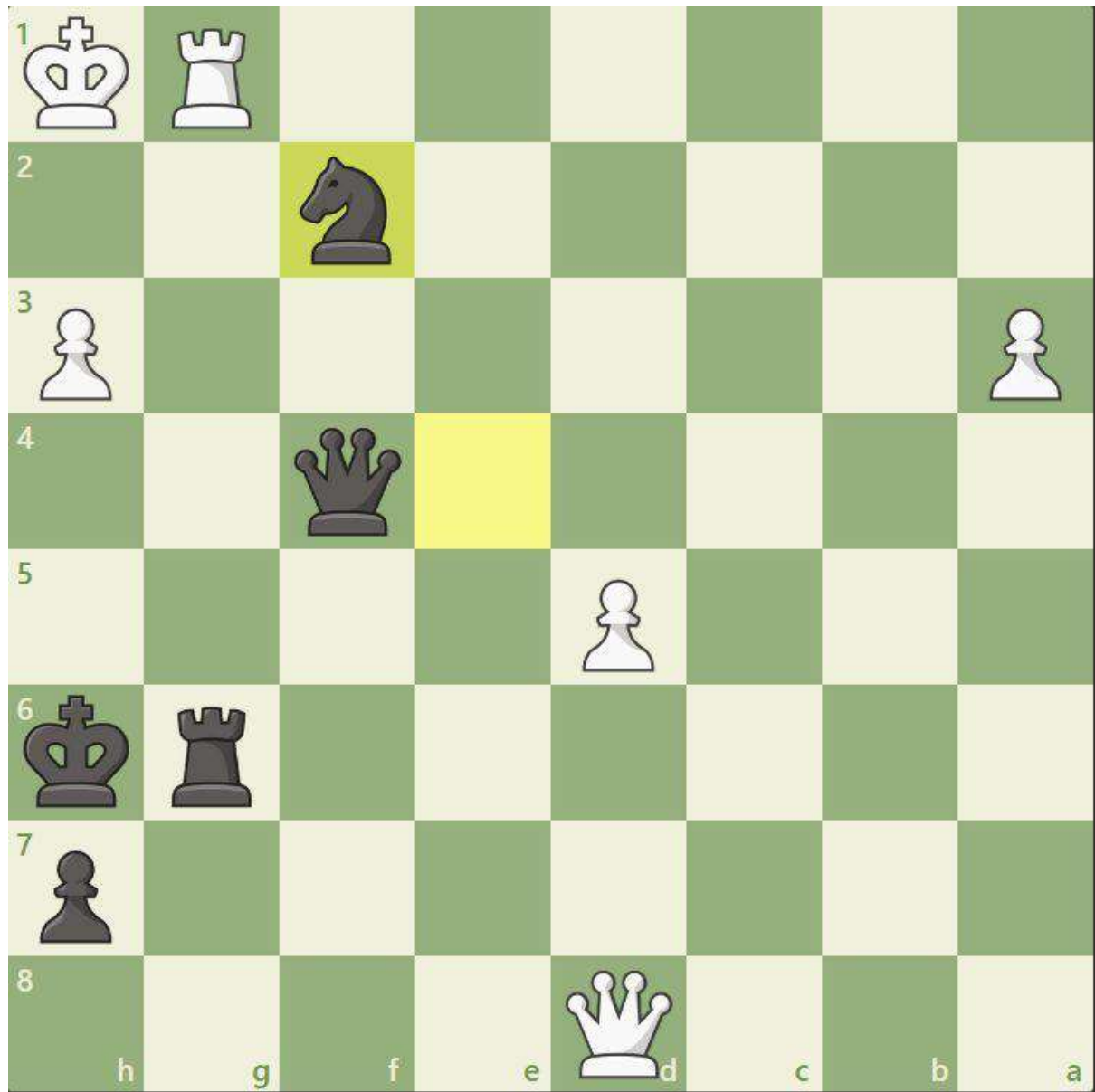


Chess Dot Com: January 25, 2026.
