Hard Muslims top of hate list

Gay students fear them most

Gay London students say Muslim extremists are the main cause of racial and homophobic tension on London university campuses, according to a new study by the NUS, the National Union of Students.

The union initiative, called Campus Watch, has a 24-hour helpline for victims of extremist activity on any British campus. Callers can report abuse of any kind and get information and advice on how to deal with it.

This year is the first anniversary of the project, which was organised in con-juction with the Union of Jewish Students and the antifacist magazine Searchlight. Over 400 cases of extremist activity have so far been reported, more than one a

day, on average. NUS president, Jim Murphy, said the project was intended to monitor far-right activity; early posters pic-tured a skinhead boot boy.

"To our astonishment,

most of the calls were about Muslim extremism," said Murphy.

Of particular concern is a group known as Hizb-ut Tahrir. Homophobia is a central part of its philosophy." The new figures give the

first real indication of the level of extremist activity on British campuses. Until now, most of the evidence has been anectodal.

Edward Lord, a gay mem-ber of the NUS National Executive Committee said: "Hizb-ut Tahrir calls for the banning of our lesbian, gay and bisexual societies and it calls gay sex a crime. We now have to provide as much support as possible to gay students. "We are organising a

campaign to remove these organisations from our campuses."

Most of the incidents have occurred on London campuses. Both the London School of Economics and London Guildhall Univer-sity have been affected and King's College was closed for the day after police said they couldn't guarantee the safety of the students or staff
