The NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FOR THE REPEAL OF THE OBSCENE PUBLICATIONS ACTS has written to the Home Secretary to express its concern over the Leader of the Opposition's recent attempt to persuade him to introduce new so-called "obscene" publications legislation before the findings of the recently appointed Williams Committee are made known. This is not expected to be for at least two years.

MR. DAVID WEBB, the National Organiser, has requested an urgent meeting with the Home Secretary to discuss the matter.

Dear Mr. Rees,

It is reported that the Leader of the Opposition has written to you asking you to consider immediate charges in the so-called "obscenity" laws, as a result of pressure exerted upon her by Ers. Pary Whitehouse who has, true to form, been busily and mischievously stirring up trouble about the virtually mythical use of children in pornography in this country. To request that you do not accede to such a request for to do so would destroy the credibility of the Villiams Committee which you have appointed and which has already begun its deliberations on these laws.

Mrs. Thatcher's request is very surprising because the anti-pornography laws in this country are amongst the strictest in Western Europe. "Pornography" has been legalised in most of the West European countries (e.g. Denmark in 1967, Sweden and the Netherlands in 1968, West Germany, Italy and Portugal in 1974 and France in 1975).

The United Kingdom is one of the only countries in Testern Europe which still jails people for "pernography" offences. Recently, for example, Ir. John Barby was sentenced to five years imprisonment at Inswich Grown Court for importing publications which are perfectly lawful on the Continent. Buch imprisonments are contrary to the European Convention on Human Rights of which the United Kingdom is a signatory.

It is also reported that Irs. Thitchouse has caked for a meeting with yourself or a Home Office I inister. I'rs. Thitchouse's only "official" capacity is that of Honorary Secretary to the National Viewers & Listeners Association. Since I have never yet seen any "child pornography" on British television, and neither has she or any of her members, her prurient interest in the subject must be regarded as obsessively personal and her arrogant demand for a meeting will, we trust, be treated with the contempt it deserves.

The N.C.N.6.P.A., on the other hand, is a much more interested party and, as its National Organiser and therefore its chief spokesman, representing the views of its many supporters, I am a much more appropriate person to request such a meeting with you. I carnestly hope that you will grant my request at an early opportunity.
