Mr. Bridgewater assured me that he was ready and waiting for you that evening with pen poised, and often kept looking out for you at the window. I can only assume that you went to the wrong address. He said that sometimes callers do go to a confusing address in Ladbroke Grove. He is an old friend of mine andfwouldn't knowingly let me down or embarrass me in such a way.

Anyway, I waited in until about 3.30 p.m. on the following day (Friday), the closing date for candidates, ready with a list of potential signatories in the Kensington Electoral Roll area, just in case you were unable to secure the the necessary ten names. Obviously you did manage it and no call came, so I was very happy about that.
