Thank you for your letter to Lord Rodge

Thank you for your letter to Lord Rodgers about the status and legitimacy of the Authority. Lord Rodgers has seen your letter and has asked me to reply to you.

The ASA is recognised by the Government and judiciary as one of the effective channels that exist to control advertisements and promotions. This system of self-regulation has been reviewed by both the Office of Fair Trading and the DTI and it is supported by the European Union.

You say that the Authority does not have any 'legally enforceable clout' but as well as having a number of very effective sanctions such as adverse publicity, the withdrawal of advertising space and the removal of trade incentives the Authority can, as a last resort, refer an advertisement to the Director General of Fair Trading under the Control of Misleading Advertisements Regulations 1988.

The Director General has powers to obtain an injunction from the court to prevent the future appearance of the advertisement. Failure to comply with an injunction would place the company in contempt of court and could lead to fines or imprisonment for those involved.

Registered in England No 733214 A Company Limited by Guarantee The self-regulatory system in the UK is both effective and flexible and it operates in an atmosphere of co-operation rather than coercion. Some 96% of press advertisements and 98% of poster advertising complies with the the Codes.
