In the United States and other countries where community radio is a reality, there is a thriving sub-culture of "underground" music. There are many informal networks and exchanges of tapes via the mail between friends and now there is also a world-wide distribution network: Kentucky Fried Royalty. KFR has contacts in nearly thirty countries including Italy, France, Poland, Yugoslavia, Israel, Brazil and Japan.

To join the network, just send a tape with a black and white cover plus information on your band/project.

The tape will be entered in the KFR catalogue and played on various community radio stations world-wide. The only guarantee KFR can offer is that you won't get rich; there are no royalties as yet.

The quality of material ranges from professionally recorded songs to out of tune instrumentals and includes poetry and experimental work.
