# NORMA

Vice girl who wouldn't live down the past

**A NEW life of vice that high class call-girl Norma Levy carved out for herself in America has collapsed.**

The 31-year-old sex hostess is certain to be deported after being convicted of entering the U.S. illegally. She will leave behind her the vice business she built up in Florida after leaving Britain in the wake of the Lambton affair.

Lord Lambton resigned as R.A.F. Minister in the Heath Government in 1973 when his affair with the call girl became known.

Norma at one time was reputed to be earning £1,000 a week as a Miami Beach sex Queen.

But yesterday she claimed she was living in a one-room flat in Fort Lauderdale and that her defence costs had to come out of public funds.

### Exposed

Of her future, she said: "I won't go back to Britain because I can't stand the climate."

"I've grown used to the Miami sunshine."

Norma will be sentenced in three weeks for yesterday's conviction.

Apart from the expected deportation order, she faces two years in jail and a heavy fine. She is expected to appeal.

Norma's downfall came last year when detectives, trying to smash a drugs ring, found her living with the man they were after.

She was exposed as a prostitute and an illegal immigrant hiding behind a smokescreen of nineteen aliases.

She had already been thrown out of America twice—but had sneaked back to run her 26-strong call-girl ring in Florida.

### Selected

Her girls were carefully selected — and noted down in a little brown address book.

Norma kept another book — now in the hands of police—which is causing some concern among Florida businessmen.

It names many of her customers, including company bosses, bankers, airline executives and even a judge. Norma was so desperate to stay in America she arranged a marriage to 41-year-old cab driver Stanton Oris.

According to Oris he

was to have been given £200 for his "services," but he received only half of that sum.

Although the couple lived together for a time, they never had sex.

He said: "The only physical contact I had with her was when we kissed just after the wedding ceremony."

He went on: "The only way I could have sex with her was to pay, just like her customers."

"Well, I just couldn't afford it. Norma was a really mean lady."

Oris said that during the good times Norma charged up to £100 a session.

She had 30 regular clients and saw about 18 of them each week.

But when the busy tourist season ended she humbled for as little as £15 a time, according to Oris.

He added that Norma had intended "retiring" from her life of vice when she had stashed away a nest egg of £125,000 from her earnings.

## Fame is the game

NORMA LEVY was just another prostitute — until she became the centre of a storm that rocked Ted Heath's Tory Government.

In May that year Junior Defence Minister Lord Lambton quit the Government for "personal and health reasons."

But three weeks later he was fined £300 for drug offences.

He told the court about a series of sex games — and Norma Levy was suddenly Britain's most famous call-girl.

She has been more in than out of the news ever since.

The widow of Indonesian President Sukarno started a libel action over her book "I, Norma Levy".

A friend jumped to her death from an eight-storey window while writing another Norma Levy book.

And Norma was alleged to have masturbated group sex orgies in a private Boeing 707 commuting between Europe and America.
