VARNING TO ANTI-FASCISTS

Due to certain remours that have come our way we have reason to believe that the dirty tricks department of the extreme Right (see Forewarmed's No2) may be attempting to frame certain immature anti-fascists and other Left-wingers on arms charges, especially in South East London.

Column 88 and the National Front would leve nothing better than to be able to "uncover" Left-wing "para-militaries" and arms dealing. The resultant publicity would result in the alienation of large sections of the public from the anti fascist cause. Also it would lead to an increase in the general level of public violence and disordor to the point where wany people would wish "a plague on both your bouses" to fascists and anti-fassists alike. Then they would not protest unduly at a Eight wing military coup to restore law and order". This is precisely the final object of the fascist strategy.

We have heard rumours that a group of . . young people in South East London have been approached by a Column 88 officer who either S.S., the O.U.N. and the N.T.S., are accepas been or is also a member of the S.W.P.,

offer ing to sell them guns and grenades. We have to be aware that it could be that the report we have received has deliberately. been directed towards us in order to mislead us, but taking all the circumstances into, account, we feel justified in giving a warning to all anti-fascists and Left Wingers. Incidentally we make it clear that the group of young people, so far as we know, have nothing to do with the S.W.P. . We believe that the ground has long been prepared for this approach by a man whom we have long suspected of being an infiltrator. He has been a close friend of this group for many years and is known in Left Wing circles as a drug seller. Pe is from a Right Wing military family back-ground and is accepted by naive Left Wingers as a sort of expert on military affairs. Thus the lies that he propagates concerning the history of the second world war, amounting to support for the roles played by such collaborationist outfits as the Famalya

Some have criticised us for publishing these names and addresses, believing that this would lead to irresponsible action by some anti-fascists. This has not happened and our confidence in our readers is vindicated. We can never agree that information needed by the working classes for their own protection should be hoarded by a few middle class "experts" and only let out in dribs and drabs according to how much they feel like trusting the working classes. We much prefer to hand the weapon of information to the workers, in particular the shop stewards committees, in full confidence that they will know how

use it responsibly.

We have had very good responses to our appeal for volunteers for fascist monitoring groups. We are pleased to be able thand some of our work over to them.

CAUSE FOR CONCERN

PART TWO OF OUR ARTICLE ON THE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE FASCIST PARA-MILITARIES

In our last article we showed how the first para-military efforts of the fascists. The organisation is structured pyramidally. in the sixties failed due to infiltration by anti-fascists who were easily able to expose them. Thus they learned the need for Each cell contains only two three or four. security and began to devise an organisation to meet their needs. They had three main needs: one to build control and coordinate the extreme Right Wing; two, to infiltrate the various organs of state that of his superiors. The cells are divided they wished to influence in their favour e.g. the armed forces, the civil service, the police, the judiciary etc etc and three, to infiltrate Left Wing and antifascist organisations both to obtain information and to act as agent provocateurs influencing immature Left Wingers into actions that would lead to their becoming alienated from the working classes.

Column 88 became the very clandestine umbrella co-ordinating organisation, arising out of John Tyndall's former Spearhead colleagues and the South Coast Wagner Circles.

These Hitlerites set about recruiting in a much tighter more careful manner. No one could simply apply to join. Even most fascists did not know of its existence. The organisation looked about for people who would be useful to them in some way either because they were already in a position of influence within the organs of state or because they had some particular skill such as a knowledge of intelligence techniques, use of arms etc. etc. First they would sound out these people to ensure that they would be likely to be sympathetic politically, befriending them socially and subtly influencing them towards more and more extreme Right Wing views. Needless to say they would thoroughly investigate the background of each potential candidate. If he proved suitable he would then be invited to join. Even this procedure was carried out very carefully and anonymously by means of recruiting tapes etc. So far as we know they have been careful enough in their selection that the invitation to join is not often refused. Once he has agreed the recruit is bound by awesome caths not to betray his colleagues and in cases where they think that it may be effective they use superstitious terror to intimidate a potential renegade. That of course is apart from threats of ordinary physical measures.

Once he is in a member never gets to

know more than a handful of his colleagues. A council of, so we understand, 13 at the top with regional brigades and small cells. members so that it is not easy for an infil trator or imposter to bluff his way into a cell.

Only the leader of a cell will know any into three main types according to their function. One third become (or already are members of other Right Wing organisations such as the National Front, British Movemen League of St. George etc and do their best to acquire positions of influence, from where they can persuade that particular outfit to develop its policies and tactics to comply with over-all 88 policy. We know that Richard Farwood Verral is one 88 representative on the N.F. directorate.

Another third become (or already are) in positions of value to 88 within the state machinery. These keep their membersh of 88 a very tight secret and use their influence to further the fascist cause as far as they can without exposing themselve One example is Lesley Vaughan (alias H 11 er) who used his position within the territorial army to arrange fascist traini camps using army equiptment (paid for by the tax payers) and mock battles with army cadets and territorial army soldiers. There are many other similar throughout th country

Column 88 also undertook the umbrella organisation of para-military training camps that have been attended by fascists from many different ultra-Right Wing political groups from Britain and abroad. Camps have been held at Epping Forest, Savernake Forest and in East Anglia (Mersea). Instru ction in the use of arms and explosives was given by experts recruited for the pur pose by 88 including ex-marine commando officers. Lesley Vaughan has many connecti ons with the marine commandos. One of their explosives experts, who calls himself the "Rook" and who lives in Sellinge in Kent is reputed to have "no nerves" and to play silly games showing off by throwing sticks of gelignite about and carrying the stuff in his pockets. Other instructors are brought in from overseas fascist outfits. In particular the Belgian V.M.O. carry out a lot of favours for 88 where something continued on page 9

to be done by someone who could be ruickly in and out of the country.

Column 88 is far from being the only fascist para-military. There are others such as the Thor Guard (youth section of the League of St George), Viking Youth carando with whom Ian Souter Clarence is believed to have connections, the Link etc at Column 88 does seem to be a common demominator, with people in each of these, though there is a great deal of over-lapping of membership all round. And 88 seems to organise liason between all these outfits and a sort of over-all policy.

In spite of their obsersion with military efficiency we understand that they nevertre-less meet with the r share of wright. muck-ups" and many of those who attended the camps learned more about the personal tabits of characters like Peter Marrinner than they ever learned about distinguishing one end of a gun from another - much to the misgust of the fanatical militarists. All has not been harmony and light either meng these who organised nor among those who attended. There is a great deal of mistrust and suspicion among their ranks. A newly recruited fascist is continually being grawn aside and warned about this man who is a "nutzig", or some other man who shoots his mouth off too much or someone else who is suspected of seeking the leadership role for himself. More often than not the one who draws him aside to warn him is himself sus pected by another. Obviously this impairs their organisation and helps anti-fascists. The dangers presented to us by these fascists est parts of Kent, Sussex, Fampshire, Wiltshould never be under-estimated but at the seme time it would be very foolish to overestimate their abilities or to see them as invincible. They are very far from it.

Further proof of their human fallibility came when they were, once again, infiltrated by Dave Roberts in the early seventies and certain of their activities exposed, including the camps at Savernake, Epping and Mersea only too well. These gangsters represent and the arrangements for Belgian V.M.O. members to take holidays in Northern Ireland

with anguaranteel kill".

After these exposures, initially they tried to lessen public alarm by presenting to the press an image of themselves as brmless cranks and nutters. They used Donald Mudie as a front man and spokesman and be succeeded in conveying this image very well. Then they decided to take even further measures against infiltration and discovery, keeping the activities of each section and brigade secret from each other. This involwed granting a far greater degree of autonomy to each brigade and now frequently even

the centre seems to know little of what is going on in some sections. Each of the regional sections has been organised to be viable on its own. Since those cells which operate within other sections of the extreme Right in any case have dual loyalties and outlooks, there is often a wide discrepancy between policies and activities from region to region.

Thus when Donald Mudie disclaimed any 88 connection with the letter bombings of King St; Collett's and the N.U.P.E. H.Q. last summer he was probably speaking the truth as far as he knew it although the 88 brigade - one of 88's fostered autonomous regional brigades - was claiming responsibility.

The various brigades which now operate under the umbrella of 88 sponsorship are more or less independent of each other and represent a collection of separate paramilitaries throughout the country: the Mussolini Brigade in East Anglia; the Eleventh Hour Brigade in London; the 88 Brigade in Yorkshire; the Adolf Fitler Command around the South Coast and several others. The Eleventh Hour has been responsible for many fire bombings and other outrages, directed particularly against immigrants in the London area, One of the more peculiar enfants terrible of 88 is the S.S. Wotan 18 which seems to operate mainly around Manchester with connections in Farrogate and Wembley.

Well readers, it is up to you. Do you think it is O.K. for these thugs to sit back in their country homes in the pleasantshire and Warwicks and plot and plan the violence, discord, terror and racial strife that now affects our big cities? Their world is a million miles away from the unemployment, poor housing, jerry-built council properties, lack of social services, and all the other features of urban deprivation which most of our readers will know the interests of private large landowners who mean to hang on to their positions of power and wealth - even if they have to sponsor a fascist seizure of state power to do so. They can be stopped - easily by a well organised, united and solid working class based anti-fascist movement. The anti-fascist movement MUST concentrate on industrial based organisation to provide the string , colider ty and proletarian discipline necessary. We must continue to labby the Home Office . to do something, now in the expectation that they will, but to expose their reluctance and to show to the workers their need to look to their cwn defence.
