## A Question Or Ten From The Floor To The "Searchlight" Representative

One of the speakers at this conference is a Mr Laurence King, who is said to be a researcher for "the international anti-fascist magazine", Searchlight.

Presumably, "anti-fascist" Mr King will be speaking on Searchlight's favourite theme, the dire necessity of destroying all our civil liberties in order to prevent an imminent fascist coup. I will not be attending this conference, having better things to waste twelve quid and a Saturday afternoon on than listening to the paid agents of the Secret State spouting their disinformation and misinformation, but as you are attending, there are a few questions you might like to ask Mr King about his editor, the people he associates with, and the quality of Searchlight's (and presumably his) research. Here they are:

- 1) Why several times in the '80s did Searchlight attempt to smear Libertarian Chris Tame as a Nazi fellow traveller and anti-Semite?
- 2) Why before that did it smear Professor Hans Eysenck as a racial bigot?
- 3) Why at the present moment is it waging a war of unconditional hatred against independent researcher Larry O'Hara branding him a Nazi fellow traveller, an errand boy for "Third Way" boss Patrick Harrington and even a Secret State nark?
- 4) Why, if editor Gable is such a dedicated "anti-fascist", does he share his bed with a woman who, in 1976 wrote, "The enemies of the White Race operate on an international scale and will continue to dictate to us if we fight amongst ourselves." (1) And no, she wasn't a "mole", she never made any secret of her ethnic origins. Like her husband, Sonia Gable nee Hochfelder, is Jewish.
- 5) Why, if Gable is such a dedicated "anti-fascist", does he associate with a man like Ray Hill, a former member of the South African National Front, the British Movement and the British National Party? (2)
- 6) Why, if the Searchlight team are such excellent researchers, did they "investigate" Column 88 from 1975-8, the Notting Hill Carnival bomb plot in 1981, and the alleged kidnap/murder plot against Gable himself in 1986, without any success? Not one prosecution nor even one arrest resulted from any of these sensationalist, but disingenuous scams.

- 7) Why, if editor Gable is such a dedicated "anti-fascist", did he go on a fishing expedition for Special Branch in 1963.(3)
- 8) Why, when he was working for London Weekend Television, did he smear a left wing journalist and engage in a two way traffic with the Secret State? (4)
- 9) Why, if Gable and co are so committed to exposing "fascist-inspired" lies, do they tell so many of their own? To give but one example: in Searchlight, issue 217, July 1993, page 7, Ray Hill writes, "[Larry] O'Hara accuses me of being a convicted fraudster and arsonist. [In his booklet A Lie Too Far] I have never been charged with or convicted of either of these offences..."

While in 1988, Hill wrote in his fictional autobiography, "In February [1979], a friend had asked me to lend him some money so that he could buy a birthday present for his wife. Not having any cash to hand...I rather foolishly handed him my credit card and told him to get what he wanted...In very little time at all he had run up a bill of more than £3,000, which I was neither willing nor able to pay. The police visited me, and I was charged with credit card fraud..." (5)

In fact, O'Hara nowhere in his pamphlet accuses Hill of being either a convicted fraudster (6) or any sort of arsonist. This means that not only is Hill a liar, but he has libelled Larry O'Hara, after having the chutzpah to accuse O'Hara of libelling him.

10) Why, if Gable is such an expert on the extreme right, did he write in his contribution to the book *Neo-Fascism In Europe*, that John Kingsley Read died in 1984, (7) when Read's obituary had appeared in *Searchlight* the following year? (8) Why did he claim in the same error-prone essay that "The success of the NF had even prompted Mosley to try several times to return to the hustings, with disastrous results." (9) [Mosley had retired from active politics before the National Front was founded]. Why, on the same page, did Gable claim that Roy Bramwell had been a former Parliamentary candidate, when no candidate with the name of Bramwell has stood for Parliament in Britain since World War I, if ever?

I could say a lot more about Mr Gable and his "anti-fascist" magazine, but I won't here. If anyone wants my definitive exposé of the Searchlight team's sloppy research, they can send me a cheque for £3.99. It's a mine of information. To the rest of you, I will say only that if you want reliable information about the far right in Britain, or Europe for that matter, you'd be better off reading the Sunday Sport. Or you could try Larry O'Hara - with whom I have absolutely no connection. His booklet
