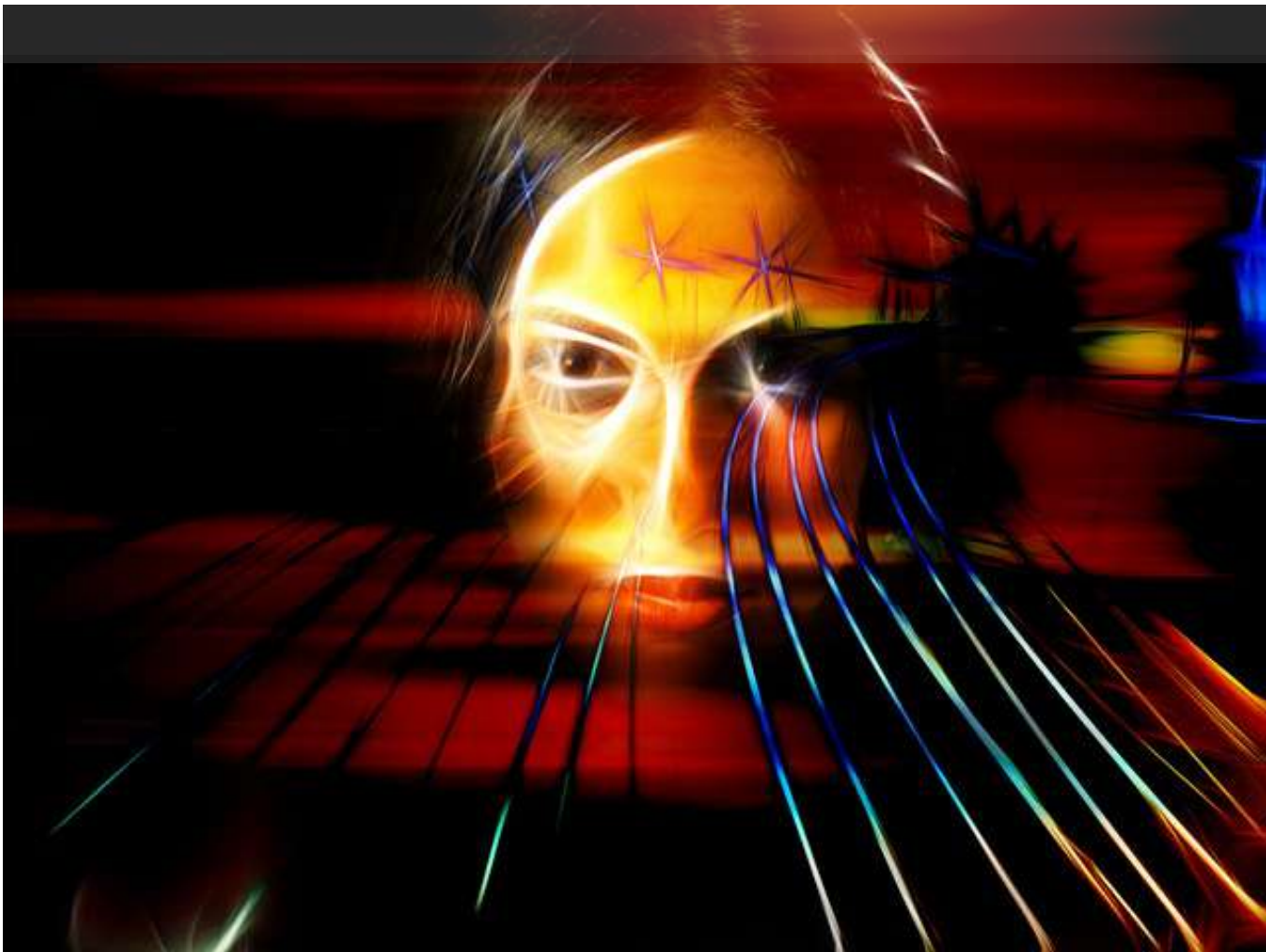


Fake Sexual Abuse Claims In The News
