The Strange World Of Bryce Williams



The horrendous on-camera double murder of Alison Parker and her colleague Adam Ward by Bryce Willams/Vester Lee Flanagan II is still making waves around the world, and will undoubtedly do so for some time. There are worse killings worldwide every day, but there appears to be something special about this one, in particular because it was carried out not simply as an act of revenge by a deranged individual against the type of people he considered had slighted him, but that it was his intention that it go viral and then some. Williams filmed the double murder – which could well have been a mass murder – with a head camera and uploaded it to social media. The video has now been copied with various edits and re-uploaded countless times including by regular media.

There has obviously been disgust and outrage at this, but in the all-seeing cyberage, this is something to which we should all learn to grow accustomed. Since the events of August 26, a great deal has been revealed about Williams. The usual suspects have tried to make a racial issue out of it, Williams being black and his two victims being white. Certainly he had a bee in his bonnet about *racism*, but although he appeared to hate white women especially, he didn't think much of black men either. What are we to make of this?

Williams was a homosexual, and blacks are far less tolerant of homosexuality than America's braindead liberal whites. His parents were also Jehovah's Witnesses, who are even less tolerant of homos than Moslems, so it is hardly surprising he never came out of the closet, at home at least, although close family are said to have been aware of his sexuality.

His father was not only a Jehovah's Witness but a distinguished sportsman, and it has been suggested he changed his professional name on that account. The London *Daily Mail* has also revealed what may be an important clue to his act of calculated madness. When he was 8 years old, Vester Flanagan Sr filed for divorce after Betty Flanagan began exhibiting bizarre and dangerous behaviour towards the boy and his two elder sisters. Could this indicate if not inherited madness then inherited something?

After graduating from San Francisco State University, he was headed for a career in the media, including as an actor; he also worked as a model before moving into mainstream reporting. It was while working for WTWC-TV in Florida that his behaviour appears to have caused concern the first time; unable to take criticism, he is said to have unnerved two female colleagues, and ended up being fired.

He found occasional media work after that until he was hired by WDBJ in April 2012, but the most interesting revelation about him is that he registered seven domains, all of them for homosexual-related websites. He appears too to have worked as a male escort, a profession that can include (homosexual) prostitution, and that has been suggested here, although these things are notoriously difficult to corroborate, and even if it is true, it may not be relevant.

The main thing one notices about Williams is his total failure to accept any sort of criticism, and his reading all manner of slights into trivial personal interactions. Alison Parker was one of the people he felt had insulted him, a claim dismissed by people who knew her. That was undoubtedly the case, and Williams was fired two years ago, yet he carried that grievance all that time, and in the end it cost Alison, her colleague, and the perpetrator himself their lives.

What sort of man would go to such extremes to right a perceived injustice, and such a trivial one at that? Sadly, the sort we meet every day; don't be too surprised if in this increasingly mad world we hear of another senseless shooting or similar outrage very soon.
