Lee Rigby – Assassins And Idiots

If you have a very short memory or if you are domiciled outside the UK, it is possible you may not have heard of Lee Rigby, who was back in the news last week; he was the soldier who was hacked to death by two Islamist fanatics in May 2013. Michael Adebolajo was one of his killers; currently he is being held in Belmarsh maximum security prison. Both he and his fellow murderer Michael Adebowale regard themselves as soldiers, and do not acknowledge the enormity of their crime. While still on remand, Adebolajo was involved in some sort of physical confrontation which cost him his two front teeth. He claimed he was assaulted by five prison officers, but he would say that, wouldn't he?

There appears to be some manufactured controversy over Rigby's birth certificate. A search of the microfiche at the British Library last Thursday turned up the following information; he was born Lee James McClure in Manchester, and his mother's maiden name was Seville. The death record gives his date of birth (Lee James Rigby) as 04/07/1987. This is in accord with both the *Internet Movie Database* and the

information on Kollerstrom's website. Kollerstrom tried to order his birth certificate, but was told there was no record of it. And?

According to the man himself, "St Catherine's House may now be the family record office...however it doesn't look as though you can visit it anymore everything is done online (for greater control of information maybe?)"

What planet is this guy living on? The indices to births, deaths and marriages were kept at Somerset House. They were moved to St Catherine's House in Kingsway, then to the Family Records Centre, Myddleton Street in 1997, which closed in 2008. However, although the actual volumes can no longer be inspected, the microfiches are held by various institutions, including the aforementioned British Library. While the migration of all such records on-line (including wills) may be annoying for some researchers, it is doubtless a great convenience to the vast majority who do not live within easy travelling distance of Central London. As for the apparent unavailability of Lee Rigby's birth certificate, there could be all manner of prosaic reasons for this. If Kollerstrom were to offer a reward of £1,000 for its production, he'd be surprised how quickly it would turn up.
