
## This Week Is A Strange Week In Numbers

Numerology is a strange belief, or maybe it is not so strange, because the strangest numbers have the strangest habits of turning up in the strangest places at the strangest times. Take pi for instance. Even if you left school a decade or two ago you will probably remember it is the ratio of a circle:  $C = \pi D$  or  $2\pi R$ . Such dates are known as palindromic, and there are some more coming up. October 5 this year is palindromic, as is October 6 next year, while if you use the American format of month then day then year, June 10 next year is palindromic.
