His television appearances include 'Zarabanda' for BBC and he has just finished playing a fisherman in 'The Lotus Eaters' for BBC 2.

NICHOLAS FIELD . . . son of one of England's great comic actors Sid Field, studied at the Webber Douglas Academy for two and a half years. 
