





The original Broadway production opened on 31st March 1943, and ran for an unprecedented 2,243 performances. Based on the play Green Grow the Lilacs, the musical is set in the old West, which was about to become Oklahoma, where the high-spirited rivalry between the local farmers and cowboys provides a colourful background against which Curly, a handsome cowboy, and Laurey, a winsome farm girl, play out their love story. The road to true love never runs smooth and with these two headstrong romantics holding the reins love's journey is as bumpy as a Surrey ride down a country road. That they will succeed in making a new life together we have no doubt, and that this new life will begin in a brand-new State provides the ultimate climax to the triumphant Oklahoma!
