Introduction

BY THE MOST REVEREND AND RIGHT HONOURABLE
THE LORD ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY

At the centre of a nation's life, there is a bewildering kaleidoscope of events, peopled by a huge and ever-changing cast of politicians and personalities. We are fortunate in having at the heart of our national life another ingredient, the presence of a family, providing a sense of continuity and pointing to the most profound themes of human life, which do not change from century to century.

We have seen Prince Charles grow up and now we are witnesses as he and Lady Diana take the most significant decision of their lives, to love, comfort, honour and keep one another as long as life shall last.

In choosing to marry each other in this spirit, the Royal couple are embracing a profound spiritual truth, close to the heart of the Christian faith: that men and women only grow to their full stature when they are able to give themselves away in love to another person. In God's eyes, we are all of infinite significance, but we are only revealed as the people God meant us to be when love for another person draws out of us the unsuspected depths of forgiveness and self-sacrifice. Marriage, as the poet Edwin Muir wrote, is:

Where each asks from each
What each most wants to give
And each awakes in each
What else would never be.

This runs counter to much of our instinctive behaviour. We like to be the centre of interest and to have other people dancing attendance upon us, but looking after Number One can be the path to self-destruction; to the creation of a personality at once hard and shallow. The other course is to open yourself up, by willingly giving yourself to another person, as those who enter Christian marriage promise to do. Then you are on the way to the depth and spiritual beauty that God intends. Those people who are always anxious about what they are getting out of a marriage are on the wrong track. The Christian way of growing into the person Christ wants us to be is by studying to give love and to cherish. With the service in St Paul's, Prince Charles and Lady Diana are setting out on this course together.

I am glad to have been invited to introduce this publication. I hope that it will help all those who will be praying for the Royal couple, and wishing them well in their future life together, to follow the service and to share in it. I also hope that it will give us all an opportunity to renew our vows to those whom we love and to thank God for them.

The music of the service, under the general direction of Sir David Willcocks, will be conducted by Mr Barry Rose, Mr Richard Popplewell, Sir David Willcocks and Sir Colin Davis.

The music will be performed by the Choir of St Paul's Cathedral; the Gentlemen and Children of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal; The Bach Choir; the Orchestra of the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden; the English Chamber Orchestra; and the Philharmonia Orchestra.

The State Trumpeters of the Household Cavalry will be directed by Major Anthony Richards, The Life Guards. The Fanfare Trumpeters of the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, will be directed by Lt-Col. George Evans, RHG/D.

Miss Kiri Te Kanawa (soprano) and Mr John Wallace (trumpet) will perform an Aria from Handel's *Samson*. The anthem 'Let the people praise thee' has been specially composed by Professor William Mathias.

Before the service Mr Christopher Dearnley, Organist of St Paul's Cathedral, and Mr John Scott, Assistant Organist, will play music by Arthur Bliss, Herbert Howells, Michael Tippett, Benjamin Britten, Malcolm Williamson, Edward Elgar, Geoffrey Bush and Ralph Vaughan Williams.

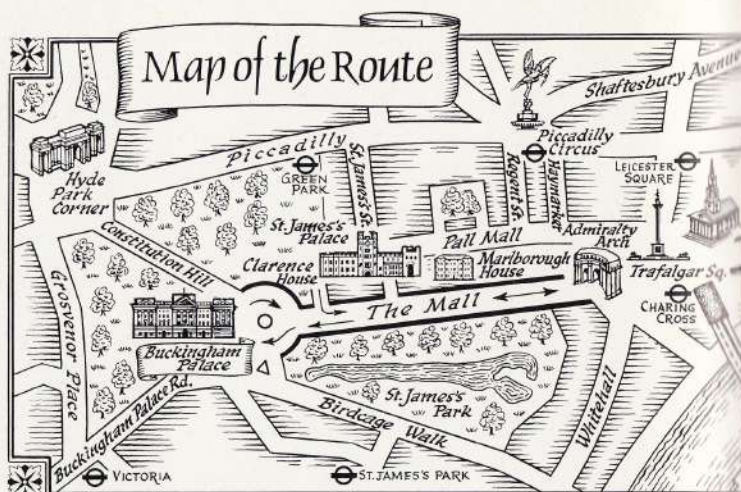

THE CARRIAGE PROCESSIONS

Many of the coaches and carriages displayed in the Royal Mews at Buckingham Palace will be used at the Royal Wedding. These include the beautiful Glass Coach. Built in 1910 and purchased by King George V for his Coronation, this will bring the bride from Clarence House to St Paul's Cathedral, and will be driven by a coachman from the box seat and drawn by a pair of Bay horses.

The bridegroom will travel to St Paul's in the 1902 State Postillion Landau, built in that year for King Edward VII. It will be drawn by four Grey Postillion horses in brass mounted State harness, with the special silver mane dressings prepared for The Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977. The Prince and Princess of Wales will return to Buckingham Palace in this Landau. However, if the weather is inclement, the bridegroom will travel to St Paul's and return with his bride in the Scottish State Coach.

Her Majesty The Queen will leave and return in an open Semi-State Landau, one of five kept in the Royal Mews, and drawn by four Greys. If the weather is wet she will travel in the Irish State Coach.

All coachmen, postillions and footmen will wear State Liveries, except the postillions of the carriage in which the bridegroom travels to St Paul's and returns to Buckingham Palace with his bride. They will wear Ascot Liveries of scarlet, purple and gold jackets, similar to The Queen's Racing Colours. The coachmen in State Livery will wear scarlet and gold frock-coats with scarlet plush knee-breeches, pink silk stockings, gold-buckled shoes, wigs and tricorn hats with ostrich feathers. Postillions will wear scarlet and gold jackets, wigs and caps, buckskin breeches and top boots.

THE FORM OF

Solemnization of Matrimony



The congregation shall remain standing.

At the day and time appointed for solemnization of Matrimony, the persons to be married shall come into the body of the Church with their friends and neighbours: and there standing together, the Man on the right hand and the Woman on the left, THE DEAN shall say,

DEARLY beloved, we are gathered here in the sight of God and in the face of this congregation, to join together this man and this woman in Holy Matrimony; which is an honourable estate instituted of God himself, signifying unto us the mystical union that is betwixt Christ and his Church; which holy estate Christ adorned and beautified with his presence, and first miracle that he wrought, in Cana of Galilee, and is commended in Holy Writ to be honourable among all men; and therefore is not by any to be enterprised, nor taken in hand, unadvisedly, lightly, or wantonly; but reverently, discreetly, soberly, and in the fear of God, duly considering the causes for which Matrimony was ordained.

First, It was ordained for the increase of mankind according to the will of God, and that children might be brought up in the fear and nurture of the Lord, and to the praise of his Holy name.

Secondly, It was ordained in order that the natural instincts and affections, implanted by God, should be hallowed and directed aright; that those who are called of God to this holy estate, should continue therein in pureness of living.

Thirdly, It was ordained for the mutual society, help and comfort, that the one ought to have of the other, both in prosperity and adversity.

Into which holy estate these two persons present come now to be joined.

Therefore if any man can shew any just cause, why they may not lawfully be joined together, let him now speak, or else hereafter for ever hold his peace.

Then, speaking unto the persons that shall be married, THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY shall say,

I REQUIRE and charge you both, as ye will answer at the dreadful day of judgment when the secrets of all hearts shall be disclosed, that if either of you know any impediment, why ye may not be lawfully joined together in Matrimony, ye do now confess it. For be ye well assured, that so many as are coupled together otherwise than God's word doth allow are not joined together by God; neither is their Matrimony lawful.

If no impediment be alleged, then shall the Archbishop say unto the Man,

CHARLES PHILIP ARTHUR GEORGE, wilt thou have this woman to thy wedded wife, to live together after God's ordinance in the holy estate of Matrimony? Wilt thou love her, comfort her, honour, and keep her, in sickness and in health; and, forsaking all other, keep thee only unto her, so long as ye both shall live?

The Man shall answer,

I will

Then shall the Archbishop say unto the Woman,

DIANA FRANCES, wilt thou have this man to thy wedded husband, to live together according to God's law in the holy estate of Matrimony? Wilt thou love him, comfort him, honour and keep him, in sickness and in health; and, forsaking all other, keep thee only unto him, so long as ye both shall live?

The Woman shall answer,

I will

Then shall the Archbishop say,

Who giveth this Woman to be married to this Man?

Then shall they give their troth to each other in this manner.

The Archbishop, receiving the Woman at her father's hands, shall cause the Man with his right hand to take the Woman by her right hand, and to say after him as followeth.

I CHARLES PHILIP ARTHUR GEORGE take thee DIANA FRANCES to my wedded wife, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy ordinance; and thereto I plight thee my troth.

Then shall they loose their hands; and the Woman, with her right hand taking the Man by his right hand, shall likewise say after the Archbishop,

I DIANA FRANCES take thee CHARLES PHILIP ARTHUR GEORGE to my wedded husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy law; and thereto I give thee my troth.

Then shall they again loose their hands; and the Man shall give unto the Woman a ring, laying the same upon the book. And the Archbishop shall say a prayer for the blessing of the ring.

BLESS, O Lord this ring, and grant that he who gives it and she who shall wear it may remain faithful to each other, and abide in thy peace and favour, and live together in love until their lives' end. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then the Archbishop, taking the ring, shall deliver it unto the Man to put it upon the fourth finger of the Woman's left hand. And the Man, holding the ring there, and taught by the Archbishop, shall say,

WITH this ring I thee wed; with my body I thee honour; and all my worldly goods with thee I share: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen.*

Then the Man leaving the ring upon the fourth finger of the Woman's left hand, they shall both kneel down: the congregation shall remain standing, and the Archbishop shall say,

Let us pray

O ETERNAL God, Creator and Preserver of all mankind, giver of all spiritual grace, the author of everlasting life; Send thy blessing upon these thy servants, this man and this woman, whom we bless in thy name; that, living faithfully together, they may surely perform and keep the vow and covenant betwixt them made, whereof this ring given and received is a token and pledge; and may ever remain in perfect love and peace together, and live according to thy laws; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then shall the Archbishop join their right hands together, and say,

Those whom God hath joined together let no man put asunder.

Then shall the Archbishop speak unto the people.

FORASMUCH as CHARLES PHILIP ARTHUR GEORGE and DIANA FRANCES have consented together in holy wedlock, and have witnessed the same before God and this company, and thereto have given and pledged their troth either to other, and have declared the same by giving and receiving of a ring, and by joining of hands; I pronounce that they be man and wife together, In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen.*

And the Archbishop shall add this Blessing.

GOD the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Ghost, bless, preserve, and keep you; the Lord mercifully with his favour look upon you; and so fill you with all spiritual benediction and grace, that ye may so live together in this life, that in the world to come ye may have life everlasting. *Amen.*

Then shall all be seated, and the Choirs of St Paul's Cathedral and Her Majesty's Chapels Royal shall sing the following anthem.

Let the people praise thee, O God: yea, let all the people praise thee.

O let the nations rejoice and be glad: for thou shalt judge the folk righteously, and govern the nations upon earth.
