THE WEST FULHAM SUNDAY FOOTBALL LEAGUE

One of the foremost Leagues in the country, the West Fulham League was formed in 1932 with 18 clubs forming two divisions. Now in 1974 there are 67 clubs in 7 divisions.

Much of the credit must go to our life President, Mr. "Dickie" Greenshields who was Secretary of the League for 18 years, and sat on the Committee of the Sunday F.A. and the London S.F.A.

He has been one of the architects of organised Sunday soccer and his forward and progressive outlook h a s

helped us toward the League we are today.

In addition to its 7 divisions, the League also runs 5 cups, and some of the clubs who played their part in building the League's good name were; Belvedere Utd., in the '50's and East Barnes in the '60's, the latter having reached the National Cup Final, and won the Open Cup three years in succession - the only club to achieve this feat.

Current sides spreading the "gospel" are Tachbrook and Fulham Supporters. The former are in the Kensitas Charity Cup Final this season, and they won the two senior League cups last season. Fulham are in the final of the Middlesex Senior Cup and good luck to both clubs in their quest for top honours.

A number of refrees have spent many seasons with us, and in this department, young Bertie Hall springs to mind (he's been in residence since the early 50's1) Mr. Hall won honours playing in the league pre-warl our able Committee has its own long-service department in the shape of Mr. Freddie Cruickshanks, our vice - Chairman. He's been with the League for 20 years!
