Although primarily a comedy, the story has many moments of drama. The author, Hugh Hastings, is particularly well qualified to write about the Navy since he served in it for 5 years during the war, joining up as a rating and later becoming an officer. He circumnavigated the world during his service with convoys, escorts, anti-E boat patrols and minelayers.

No trouble has been spared to present an authentic Naval background. The Admiralty have supplied all the furniture and 'props' and an expert on Naval matters was sent by them to supervise the production. The setting by Michael Weight is based on a shore station at Milford Haven where he was stationed for a time during the war.

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
