Other shops, around the building, include the Chemists, Ironmongers, Boot Repairers, Post Office, Photographers, Tailors, Toy Shop and an Office.


You will also find displays of "Christmas Past", Jewellery, Spring Cleaning, Sporting activities and many more...




The Museum has a completely separate Gift Shop, which you are very welcome to just browse around at any time.


