The unerring artist of the simple life, Eden Philpotts, has painted a delightful and refreshing picture of sanny Devon in bright but homely colours in "Devonshire Cream." Indeed, as you hear the quaint rustic talk of the natives, you can almost smell the new-mown hay and sweet scent of the crushed cider apples.

To old Elias Widecombe, of Coombe Farm, all Blanchards are anathema. Nothing good ever came out of Twelve Tree Farm. No matter that the present representative of the Blanchard family is a fine well-set-up, honest young man. Everything that he does has a purpose-and no good purpose at that! When he begins to pay court to Farmer Widecombe's pretty young daughter, well, the fat is in the fire for sure! This is another genu of rustic comedy, and there are folk who consider it more entertaining than "The Farmer's Wife" or "Yellow Sands."

In the West End production, first staged at the Playhouse on February 14th, 1930, Sam Livesy depicted the head-strong farmer, Elias Widecombe; Mary Jerrold portrayed his wife, and Horace Hodges gave a choice study of William Blee, a joy and blessing to men and of the same tradition as Churdels Ash.

Riias Widecombe will be played next week by Franklin Davies, Amy Widecombe by Marian Marshall, William Blee by Russell Stanwyck, Jenny Sweet by Joan Charlesworth, Joseph Munday by Peter Bell and Robert Blanchard by Nevil Whiting.


