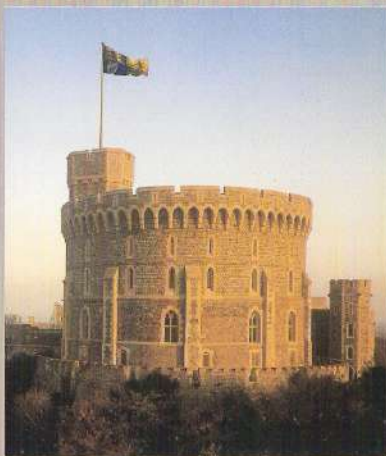

Thank you for purchasing tickets for the Official Residences of The Queen. Please note:

- Visits are self-guided and visitors are encouraged to tour at their leisure. Wardens are available to assist throughout the visit.
- To help visitors enjoy the visit fully, a comprehensive Official Guide for Windsor Castle, the Palace of Holyroodhouse and the State Rooms at Buckingham Palace is available for purchase at each entrance in English, Japanese, French, Italian, Spanish and German languages.
- For safety reasons, visitors and their belongings are subject to security checks. Baggage and items such as umbrellas, pushchairs and electrical equipment must be checked in and reclaimed at the end of the visit.
- Photography, filming, use of mobile telephones, smoking and eating are not permitted at any of the Official Residences, with the exception of the Royal Mews and the Palace of Holyroodhouse, where photography and filming are permitted in certain areas.

Visitors to the State Rooms at Buckingham Palace please note:

- Visitors with young children should take extra care in the garden, as the visitor route is situated close to a lake.
- The lavatory and baby care facilities are situated at the **end** of the tour.
