Marking the centenary of the start of WW1 (1914-1918) Sydenham Arts Festival and in-house theatre company Spontaneous Productions have joined forces with local community groups and schools to tell the gripping story of the 458 workers of Sydenham's South Suburban Gas Company who fought during the Great War - 58 of whom made the ultimate sacrifice - through the eyes of the soldiers themselves and those on the 'home front'.


